Applying Systems Thinking for Food Systems Transformation 5 October 2023, 11:00 – 12:00 (CEST) | Virtual

Background

Since its establishment in April 2022, the UN Food Systems Coordination Hub has convened multiple virtual dialogues to facilitate peer learning on transforming food systems. These dialogues have witnessed active engagement from National Convenors and various stakeholders within the food system, who have expressed the need to expand the topics and thematic areas discussed. Within this framework, the Hub has scheduled a series of Food Systems Solutions Webinars (FSS Webinars) to foster knowledge diffusion and enhance science-policy interfaces for 2023.

Purpose of the Webinar
